Call for Posters

Objective: The objective of the 2016 Conference is to encourage continued interaction among land managers, scientists, the green industry and the public concerning the ecology and management of invasive plants in natural and managed ecosystems. Poster presentations are requested from researchers, land managers, and horticulturalists from both the public and private sectors. Poster presentations on subjects pertaining to all aspects of invasive plants are invited.

Dates and Format

- **Poster title and abstract due: DECEMBER 15, 2015**
- **Notification of acceptance: December 31, 2015**
- **Conference: February 11, 2016**

Abstract preparation: An abstract of 350 words or less and single-spaced must be submitted in Times New Roman 12-point font. The abstract can be written in multiple paragraphs and should not include figures, tables, or references. Please include the contact author's name, affiliation, address, phone number, and email. In the author list, please give the first and last name of each author, and their affiliation if different from that of the first author.

The abstract should follow this basic outline:

- Describe the problem
- State objectives
- Explain methodology
- Present results
- Discuss implications for invasive plant species management

In the subject line and in naming the document, please use the word "OIPC Abstract" followed by your last name, i.e. OIPC Abstract Jones.

Poster space is limited, so early submission is encouraged.

Abstracts will be made available to all Conference participants, and will also be linked to the OIPC website.

Poster preparation: A limited number of poster easels are available and each will display a 60" x 44", or smaller, horizontal poster; however presenters have the option of bringing their own easel. Ultimately, posters should be easily readable from a distance of 6ft.
